Lemon Cake

1 cup castor sugar	1 rounded tbs cornflour
2 eggs	½ cup milk
4 oz. (125g) butter	1 tbs grated lemon rind
1 ½ cups self raising flour	

Method

Sift flour and cornflour, add sugar and lemon rind. Stir in softened butter, lightly beaten eggs and milk. Beat well for five minutes. Spoon mixture into greased 8" (20cm) round cake tin with greased greaseproof paper on base. Bake in moderate oven approx 40mins. Cool, ice on top with lemon flavoured icing.

RULES OF ENTRY: Please read all requirements carefully.

1. Entries are to comply with item description and size specifications.
2. Entry details are to be completed on specially produced forms and pasted to the back of the entries.
3. Awards will be given to the best entries in each section determined by the Judges.
4. All entries are to be ready for collection in the week commencing 7 June 2010 unless other arrangements are made.
5. Entries will be returned to school in the first week of Term 3.
6. All entries will be judged by teachers with no vested interest in the outcome.
7. All entries in sections 2-6 must be no larger than A4 and able to hang. Entry details must be on the back of entries to allow judging to be anonymous.
