GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTRIES:-

1. All Entries in Section 1 through to Section 18 will be accepted from 7am to 6pm on Monday 24th June.
2. All entries in Sections 19 through to Section 28 will be accepted from 7am to 6pm on Wednesday 26th June.
3. **All exhibits, prize cards and ribbons can be collected between 4:30 pm- 6pm Sunday 30th June, (Please note: Strictly no vehicle access or parking available on Showgrounds on Sunday at anytime) or 7:30 am – 12pm Monday 1st July, or after this time by appointment only.** Please phone Secretary on 55302754 or 0418182533 to arrange.
4. No prize money, prize ribbons, cards or exhibits will be returned without presentation of **Entry Ticket Stubs.**
5. **If not more than three exhibits are entered in any class a High Achievement card may only be issued.**
6. All judges' decisions are final.
7. Exhibits must not have been entered in a previous Mudgeeraba Show and must be no more than 2 years old. All entries must be the property of, the work of, or grown, made or baked by the exhibitor.
8. Entries registered "For Sale" may only be sold through the Society on the exhibitor's behalf on a 15% commission.
9. All entries, exhibits or nominations must be presented in person at the dates and times specified in the schedule. No postal or email entries will be accepted under any circumstances.
10. Novice exhibitors are persons who have not won a PRIZE in any class previously at the Mudgeeraba Show. Novice entrants must not derive a living associated with any product or item entered in that section or class.
11. **All perishable exhibits not collected by 11am on Monday 1st July will be disposed of by the Show Society.**
12. PLEASE NOTE: Every endeavour will be undertaken for the security and protection of all exhibits, however, no responsibility will be accepted by Mudgeeraba Show Society Inc. for loss or damages.
13. The Committee reserves the right to cancel or refuse entry of any exhibit without giving reason for doing so.
14. The Committee reserves the right to remove any item which is considered dangerous or objectionable.
15. Prizes may be withheld if, in the opinion of the judge, exhibits are not of sufficient merit. With the approval of the Donor, the Society reserves the right to withhold the award of any trophy if sufficient entries are not received.

Exhibits must not have been entered in a previous Mudgeeraba Show and must be no more than 2 years old. All entries must be exhibitor's own work.

Novice exhibitors are persons who have started the craft to which the class pertains less than 3 years ago and have not previously won a first prize in classes associated with that craft at this show.

Judges decisions are final.

- Class 1. Fibre from the ground up – One skein of handspun fibre. Wool must include staple, cotton must include boll, linen must include raw flax, mohair include lock of fibre, etc.
- Class 2. One skein of handspun animal-based fibre.
- Class 3. One skein of handspun plant-based fibre.
- Class 4. One skein of handspun mixed fibre. State fibres used and if commercially prepared or if hand mixed by blending board, hand carding etc.
- Class 5. One skein of handspun designer/art yarn.
- Class 6. One skein of spindle spun, spindle plied fibre.
- Class 7. One skein of Navajo, Crepe or Cable plied handspun fibre – 1 entry per technique or 2 entries maximum.
- Class 8. One skein of handspun, hand-dyed natural fibre. State if natural or commercial dyes were used.

- Class 9. One skein of handspun fibre supplied by club. Fibre is not to be dyed or mixed with other fibres.
- Class 10. Novice Spinner – One skein of handspun yarn by a novice. Any fibre and any technique.
- Class 11. Any handwoven item.
- Class 12. Item woven on a rigid heddle loom (Knitters, Sampleit, Rigid Heddle etc.)
- Class 13. Any item of weaving by novice.
- Class 14. Piece of textured weaving or tapestry weaving – unmounted.

- Class 17. Any needle felted item. Must be all hand needle felted; support wire and eyes etc. allowed.

RULES FOR DECORATED CAKE SECTION

1. The base, presentation board or drape must be fitted within the perimeter of a 45cm square, unless otherwise stated. 2. The base boards must be raised on cleats sufficient to enable ease of handling. 3. No non sugar ornaments allowed. 4. Reasonable use of wire, tape stamens, ribbon and tulle is permitted. 5. No pins allowed holding ribbons and wire must not penetrate cake. Posy picks must be used. 6. No artificial paper/fabric leaves, flowers or feathers to be used, 7. Lace and extension work is not mandatory; however, variety of decorating skills within the bounds of good taste must be executed. 8. All entries must be the handiwork of the exhibitor. 9. Polystyrene blocks or dummies may be used. 10. Any score sheets filled out by the judge will be returned with exhibits. 11. All entries will be returned to exhibitor. 12. Failure to comply with these conditions will result in the exhibit not being eligible for a prize.

KENTISH CAKE

Ingredients: 110g butter
 $\frac{3}{4}$ cup sugar
 1 cup S. R. flour
 2 eggs, well beaten
 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ tablespoons coconut
 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ tablespoons cocoa
 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup altogether of chopped nuts, cherries and sultanas.
 1 teaspoon vanilla (or rum)
 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup milk

Method: Preheat oven to 170-180 deg C. Grease a 22cm x 11cm (approx. size) tin. Mix cocoa with a very little hot water (coconut and nuts may be soaked in milk, if preferred). Beat butter and sugar to a cream, add eggs, then cocoa and fruit. Add milk, coconut and nuts and vanilla, lastly add flour.

Bake for 45minutes, or until cooked when tested. Ice with chocolate icing and decorate with toasted coconut or nuts.
