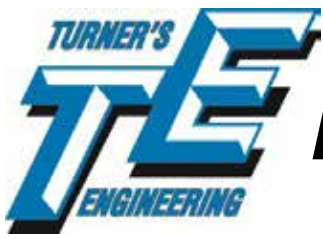

Anzac biscuit recipe (Ingredients for 24 biscuits):

- 125gm butter, chopped
- 1 cup plain flour
- ½ tsp bicarb soda
- 1 cup rolled oats
- 1 cup caster sugar
- 2 tbs golden syrup
- 2 tbs boiling water
- ¾ cup desiccated coconut

Combine butter and golden syrup in a pan, stir over heat until butter is melted. Stir in combined soda and water, then remaining ingredients. Mix well. Drop rounded teaspoons of mixture about 4cm apart on greased over trays and flatten slightly. Bake in a slow oven for about 20 minutes or until slightly brown. Cool on tray.

Woodchopping at the Mudgeeraba Show is more than just a competition. It's a tradition that goes back to the **early timber days** of Australia, and it's still one of the most **exciting** parts of the Show. The **crack of the axe**, the **flying chips**, and the **crowd cheering** from the grandstands have been part of the atmosphere here for generations.

At Mudgeeraba, woodchop is kept alive by local families who have supported the arena year after year. Names like the **Newman's**, the **Franklin's** and the **Hinze's** are woven into the history of the event. They've contributed **competitors, time, knowledge** and plenty of hard work behind the scenes to keep the tradition going.

When the competition gets underway in Franklin Arena, the **atmosphere** is something special. The competitors size up their logs, the starter calls them in, and before long the **axes are swinging**. It's **strength, skill and grit** all rolled into one, with athletes racing the clock and each other while the crowd counts every strike.

Adding to the excitement, the **Mudgeeraba Show** proudly hosts the **275mm Queensland Tree Felling Championship**, drawing some of the best woodchoppers from across the state. It's a **big moment** on the woodchop calendar and a **real point of pride** in our own backyard.

Whether you're a lifelong fan or a first-time spectator, woodchopping at Mudgeeraba delivers **unforgettable action, tradition, and country spirit**.

Peter is a familiar and respected figure in our community, having called Mudgeeraba home for more than 40 years. His life has been deeply intertwined with horses, agriculture, and service to others, values that sit at the very heart of our Show and the agricultural show movement. Raised in outback Queensland, on a cattle property, Peter often jokes that he was "born on a horse".

Peter's connection to the Mudgeeraba Show runs deep. As a Life Member, this year marks his 40th anniversary of involvement in our Equestrian Competition. Decades of dedication as Ring Secretary and Ring Master has seen Peter support competitors, mentor riders, and help to deliver one of the Show's most loved and enduring traditions.

Beyond our Equestrian Ring, Peter continues to give back to the community as the long serving President of the Gold Coast Light Horse Education Museum, where he helps preserve the proud history and legacy of Australia's Light Horse. Peter has also achieved personal success in equine sport, having been crowned Queensland Tent Pegging Champion.

In 2025, Peter demonstrated the true spirit of service when he volunteered with the Great Australian Charity Drive, playing a vital role as the official horse tailer for a mob of 1,700 head of cattle. Over the course of the journey, Peter spent 90 days in the saddle and 90 nights in a swag, embodying the resilience, teamwork, and mateship that define rural Australia.

Some might recognise Peter from his time as a founding cast member of Outback Spectacular, where he performed six days a week for an incredible 16 years, showcasing horsemanship and Australian heritage to audiences from around the world. Peter has also served as a Mounted Steward, wearing his red coat in the Main Arena at the Royal Queensland Show (Ekka) for over 26 years, helping ensure the smooth and safe running of one of Australia's most iconic agricultural show equestrian events.

Peter's commitment to the horse industry has also been formally recognised through his Life Membership of the Australian National Saddlehorse Association, a testament to his lifelong contribution to the development and promotion of equestrian excellence.

Peter's story is one of commitment, community, and country values. His service to agriculture, horsemanship, and the local community makes him a fitting and inspiring choice to officially open the 2026 Mudgeeraba Agricultural Show.

For over 40 years, Australian Show Ribbons based at Warwick QLD, have been a cornerstone of Australia's Agricultural Show traditions.

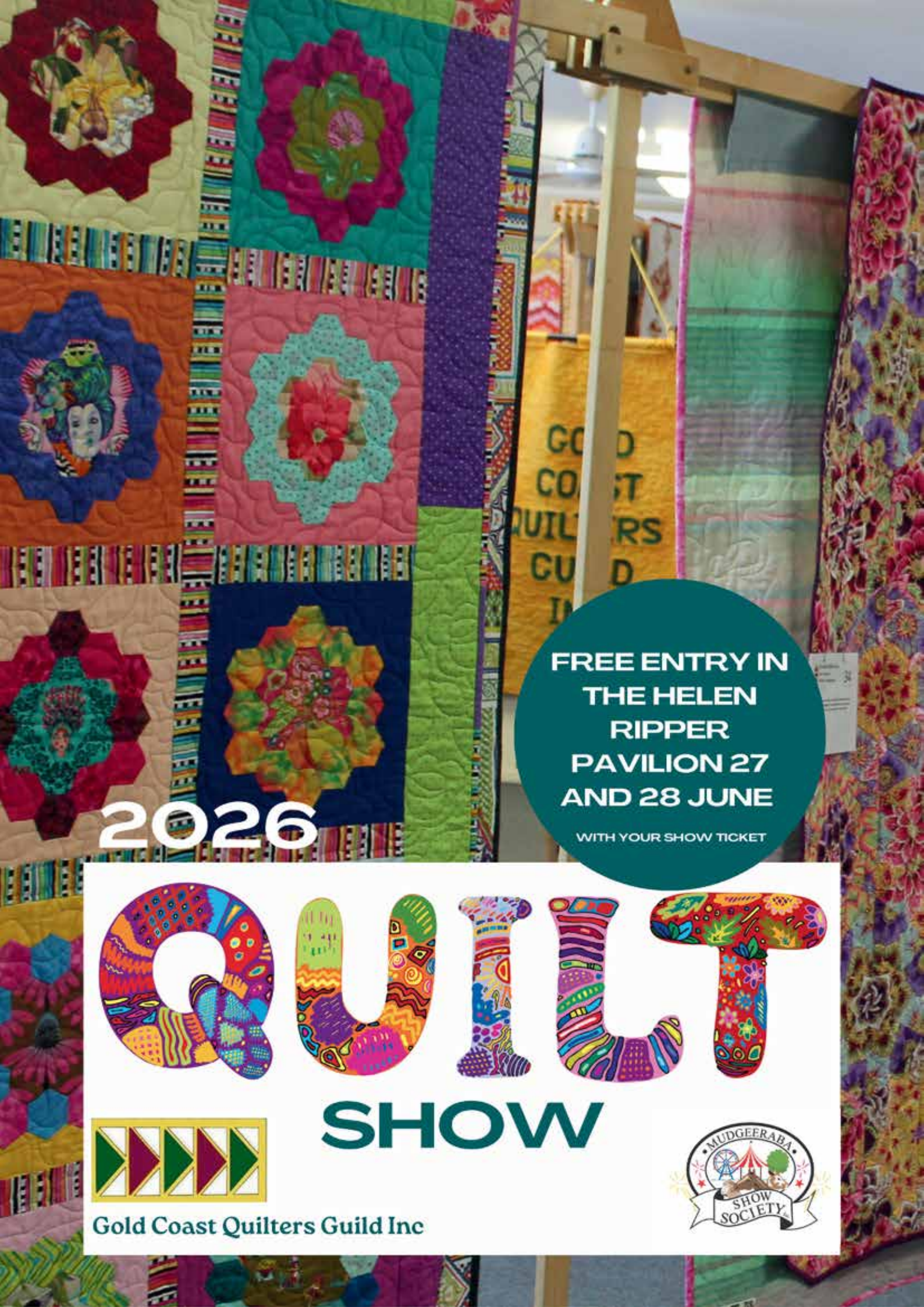

BEHIND THE TROPHIES



Peter English Memorial Trophy

Peter English was born on 11 July 1917 in Manly, NSW, and had a lifelong love of animals, especially horses. After serving in the Australian Army and rising to the rank of Sergeant Major, he and his wife Thelma settled in Mudgeeraba.

Peter became a dedicated member of the Mudgeeraba Pony Club and the Mudgeeraba Show Society, serving as secretary and helping support the growth of the local show and showgrounds. Known for his fairness, leadership, and passion for horsemanship, he encouraged many young riders and volunteers.

Peter passed away on 16 October 2008. His contribution to the Mudgeeraba Show is honoured through a perpetual trophy awarded in his name each year.

George Franklin Memorial Trophy

George William Franklin was born on 29 October 1937 in Southport and spent his entire life in Mudgeeraba. Part of a long established local family, he grew up helping on the family dairy farm and later worked in the Mudgeeraba sawmills before becoming a butcher at the local butcher shop, where he remained until retirement.

George was a passionate woodchopper and crosscut sawyer, competing for more than 35 years. He was also heavily involved in the Mudgeeraba Show, helping prepare the woodchopping arena and timber blocks for competition.

George passed away in 2023. His contribution to the show is remembered through the George Franklin Memorial Trophy for the Veteran Chop.



Elsie Laver Memorial Trophy

Annie Elsie Laver, known as Elsie, was born on 15 December 1899 in Mudgeeraba and was part of one of the district's early pioneer families who helped establish the township.

When the Mudgeeraba Show began in 1928 as a small fete and flower show to raise funds for the Memorial Hall, Elsie was a keen supporter. Known as an excellent cook, she often arrived with many cake entries and volunteered her time to assist with the event.

Elsie was also a skilled side saddle horsewoman and active in the local church and community groups. She passed away on 9 December 1972, remembered for her strong community spirit.

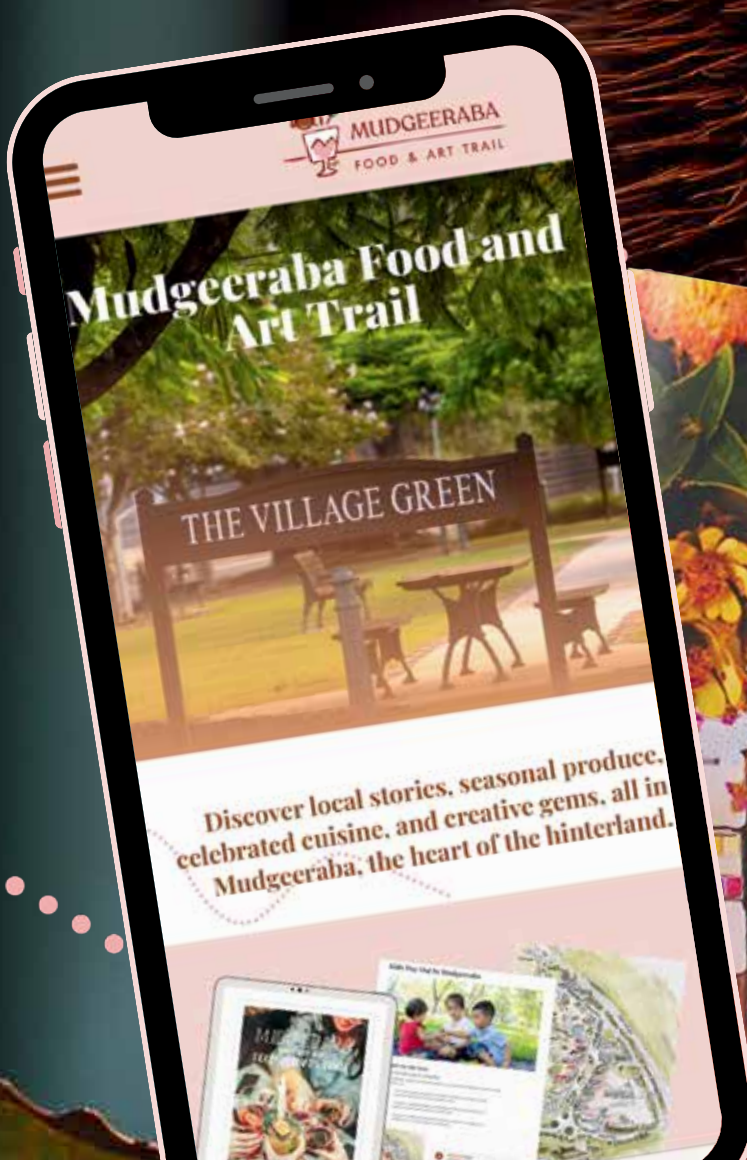

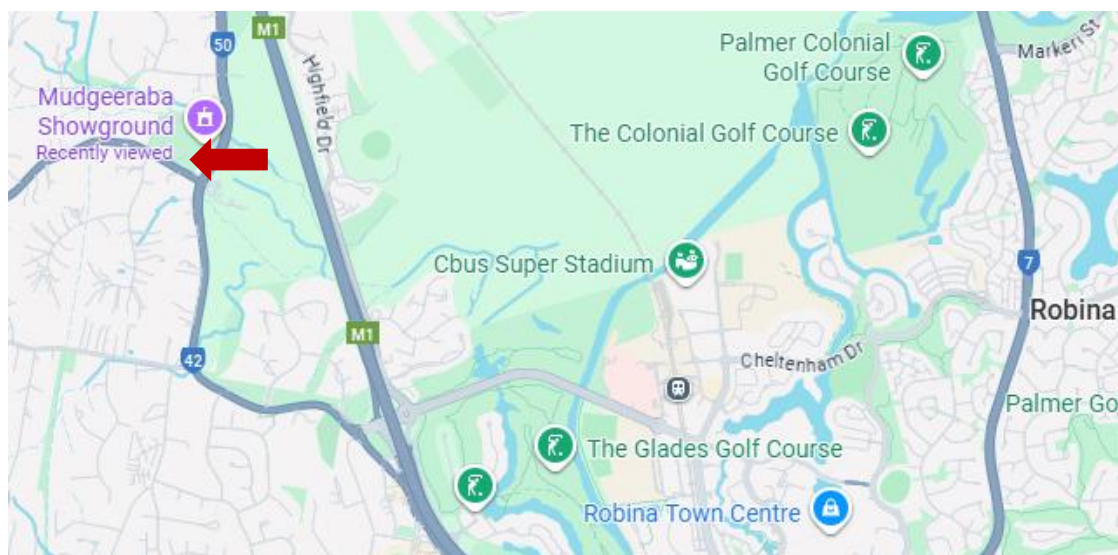

Poultry Pavilion Rules and Procedures

BIRD CHECK-IN

The Mudgeeraba Show Poultry Pavilion is located on Worongary Road, Worongary, opposite Alawara Drive.



Dates, times and parking arrangements:

Due to space constraints at the Showgrounds, we encourage poultry exhibitors to drop off their birds between **2pm and 6pm on Friday 26 June 2026** using the Horse Float Entry Gate and designated poultry parking bays on Worongary Road, indicated on the map below. After parking, please bring your birds directly to the poultry pavilion where a steward will direct you to your pre-allocated pens.

If you are unable to pen your birds on Friday, you may arrange to drop your birds off – by appointment – strictly between **6am and 7:30am on Saturday 27 June 2026**, however please be aware that parking capacity during this timeframe is limited and spots will be allocated on a first-come-first-served basis.

At 8am on Saturday, parking in the designated poultry parking area on Worongary Road (refer to map below) reverts to disabled parking. **If your vehicle is still in these parking bays after 8am on Saturday it may be towed.**

To apply for Saturday morning drop off please check the applicable box on the entry form. A steward will contact you and provide you with a special pass that you must show at the ticket booth on your arrival on Saturday morning.

Once penned, birds must not be handled without the permission of the Chief Steward.

SORRY NO WALK-INS: Due to limited pen space, we can no longer accept last-minute walk in entries on either Friday 26 June or Saturday 27 June. All nomination forms must be submitted, and entry fee payments made, by Friday 19 June to secure pen space.

ANIMAL WELFARE

All birds will be fed by Show volunteers throughout the two days of the Show, except on the morning of judging. Birds will be provided a bedding of fine wood shavings and have access to ample clean drinking water at all times.

The Mudgeeraba Show Society takes all care but accepts no responsibility for the birds exhibited.

Birds showing signs of sickness, disease or parasite infestation will not be penned and will be disqualified. If a bird begins showing any of these conditions during the period they are penned at the Mudgeeraba Show, the exhibitor will

be contacted and the Chief Steward may ask for the bird to be removed from the pavilion. Please consider the health of other birds at the Show.



BIRD CHECK-OUT

Birds may be collected between **4pm and 5:30pm on Sunday 28 June 2026**. The designated parking bays on Worongary Road will only become available for bird collection from 4pm. The Horse Float Entry Gate will also open for bird collection from 4pm.

Alternatively, birds may also be collected between **9am and 11am on Monday 29 June 2026** with parking available at the back of the pavilion via the Horse Float Entry Gate. To apply for Monday morning collection please check the applicable box on the entry form and a steward will contact you.

JUDGING AND PRESENTATIONS

The 2026 Mudgeeraba Show Poultry Pavillion judge is Mr John Kendall.

Judging will start at **9am on Saturday 27 June 2026** with the presentation of awards to be held at **2pm the same day**, at the poultry pavilion. The Judge's decision is final.

All Open and Junior classes will be judged according to the Australian Poultry Standards.

Birds that have been dyed or whose appearance has been interfered with in any way, may be disqualified and birds wearing removable identification such as leg bands may also be disqualified.

Categories in the 'Just for Fun' section will be judged by the Chief Steward and Poultry Pavilion volunteers.



Poultry Pavilion Rules and Procedures

The 'Locals Only' section will be judged by **Gold Coast City Councillor Glenn Tozer** and his decision will be based solely on superficial good-looks, style and charisma. No regard will be given to pedigree or Australian Poultry Standards, and the Councillor's decision will be final.

POULTRY PAVILION RULES

1. The Mudgeeraba Show Society may refuse any entry.
2. The Mudgeeraba Show Society reserves the right to amend the schedule at any time.
3. Should a dispute arise where there is no specific rule, the matter will be referred to the Chief Steward and Show Committee and their decision will be final.
4. Once penned, the birds must not be handled without the permission of the Chief Steward.
5. Birds that have been dyed or whose appearance has been interfered with in any way, may be disqualified.
6. Birds wearing removable identification such as leg bands may be disqualified.
7. Birds showing signs of sickness, disease or parasite infestation will not be penned and/ or will be disqualified. The Chief Steward will request the owner to remove the bird from the Poultry Pavillion.
8. Birds entered in the Exhibition Pairs category cannot also be entered in other categories.
9. Birds entered in the Locals Only and Just for Fun sections are allowed to also be entered in other categories.
10. All eggs laid while birds are penned at the Mudgeeraba Showgrounds become the property of the Mudgeeraba Show Society.
11. Both alcohol consumption and smoking are strictly prohibited within the poultry pavilion.
12. Whilst the greatest care will be taken with all exhibits, the Mudgeeraba Show Society will not be held responsible for any damage or loss.
13. **Rules for Junior section:**
 - a. All junior exhibitors must be between 5 – 14 years of age at the time of the Show.
 - b. Exhibits in the Junior section are not eligible for major awards.
 - c. Junior exhibitors must be present to pen their entered birds.
14. **Rules for Locals Only section:**
 - a. Open to any breed of hen or rooster from Gold Coast City Council Division 9 – mixed breeds welcome.
 - b. Both owner and entered bird must reside in one of the following Division 9 suburbs: Mudgeeraba, Highland Park, Worongary, Tallai, Bonogin, Gilston, Advancetown, Numinbah Valley, Natural Bridge, Springbrook or Austinville.
 - c. The exhibitor will be asked to provide photo ID containing their current address at time of penning.
