General Information

When is the 2026 Mudgeeraba Agricultural Show?

The 2026 Mudgeeraba Agricultural Show will be held on Saturday 27 June and Sunday 28 June 2026 at the Mudgeeraba Showgrounds.

Where is the Show held?

Mudgeeraba Showgrounds, 115 Mudgeeraba Rd, Worongary on the Gold Coast.

What are the Show opening hours?

Saturday 8am - 8pm

Sunday 8am - 4pm

Is the Show suitable for all ages?

Absolutely! The Show offers entertainment, competitions, animals, exhibits, food, rides and activities for all ages.



Tickets

Does my ticket include attractions?

Yes. Almost all entertainment, exhibits and attractions are included in your admission ticket.

Are rides included in my ticket?

No. Sideshow rides operate independently and ride tickets are purchased separately.

Can I buy tickets online?

Yes. We strongly recommend purchasing tickets online before attending the Show to avoid queues.

Can I buy tickets at the gate?

Yes, tickets are available at the gate.

Do I need to print my ticket?

No. Digital tickets on your phone are accepted.

Getting to the Show

What's the easiest way to get to the Show?

We recommend:

1. FREE Park & Ride Shuttle Bus
2. Translink Route 758
3. Walking, riding or scooting if you're local
4. Official Event Parking (\$10 per vehicle)



Is there a free shuttle bus?

Yes. The Mudgeeraba Show Society provides a FREE Park & Ride Shuttle Bus service throughout the weekend. Buses run continuously between:

- Mudgeeraba Showgrounds
- Firth Park
- Mudgeeraba State School
- Robina Station Kiss & Ride
- Gold Coast Hinterland Heritage Museum

What time do the shuttle buses start?

Saturday

- First services approximately 7:45am
- Last departures from the Showgrounds approximately 8:00pm–8:15pm

Sunday

- First services approximately 7:45am
- Last departures from the Showgrounds approximately 4:00pm–4:15pm

Can I catch public transport?

Yes. Translink Route 758 stops directly outside the Showgrounds.

Is there parking?

Yes. Official event parking is available for \$10 per vehicle and provides direct pedestrian access to the Showgrounds via the underpass.

Can I park in nearby streets?

Only if you are parked legally and safely. Council Parking Compliance Officers will be patrolling the precinct throughout the weekend. Please respect our neighbours and follow all signage.

Why are there parking restrictions around the Showgrounds?

The City of Gold Coast operates an Event Traffic Area during the Show to improve traffic flow and safety for visitors and local residents.

Animals & Agriculture

Will there be animals?

Absolutely! Animals are at the heart of an agricultural show. You'll find:

- Horses
- Cattle
- Poultry
- Working dogs
- Cattle
- Sheep
- Pigs
- Animal Nursery & Petting Zoo
- Miniature goats
- Heritage and Agricultural displays



Can I pat and feed the animals?

Some animals can be interacted with under supervision. Please always follow the instructions and signage of exhibitors and animal handlers.

Can I bring my own dog?

No. For the safety of our animals, exhibitors and visitors, pet dogs are not permitted inside the Showgrounds at anytime.

Registered assistance animals are welcome. Permits/Licences will be requested on entry.

Food & Facilities

Can I buy food at the Show?

Yes. A wide range of food vendors will be operating throughout the weekend.

Can I bring my own food and drinks?

Yes. You can bring your own homemade food and non-alcoholic drinks, which is a cost effective option.

Water stations are provided around the grounds where attendees can fill up their water bottles free of charge.

Are there toilets and baby change facilities?

Yes. Amenities are available throughout the grounds. See maps for locations

Accessibility.



Is the Showgrounds wheelchair accessible?

Much of the Showgrounds is accessible; however, please remember this is a 13 acre outdoor event site with grassed areas, gravel paths and uneven ground in some locations.

Can Companion Card holders attend?

Yes. Companion Card holders are welcome.

Smoking & Vaping

Can I smoke or vape at the Show?

No.

The Mudgeeraba Agricultural Show is a STRICTLY SMOKE-FREE AND VAPE-FREE EVENT.

Smoking and vaping are prohibited throughout the Showgrounds and it's buildings including:

- Open spaces
- Seating areas
- Walkways
- Grandstands
- Food areas
- Animal areas
- Car parking areas within the event precinct



Visitors are asked to respect the health and comfort of other patrons, volunteers, exhibitors and animals. Queensland Health officers may be in attendance and penalties may apply.

Where is First Aid?

Qualified First Aid personnel and Paramedics are on site throughout the Show. Locations are marked on the Show map.
